




World Mission News

Have you ever thought about joining Mothers' Union?

Mothers' Union is a global Christian organisation working with people of all faiths and none to develop communities, strengthen family life, and where necessary, advocate for change built on justice and fairness for all. Branches of Mothers' Union (MU) are found in 83 countries throughout the world, including here in the UK.

There is still much work to be done to end violence (particularly against women) and to alleviate poverty and injustice where it exists.

At St Neots' branch of MU we are a dedicated and friendly group. We have an annual programme of speakers and social activities such as organising a fundraising garden party for AFIA (Away from it all), which MU organises to provide holiday breaks for families who otherwise would not be able to afford the cost. We regularly host a Deanery Advent Service and lunch for other local MU branches with the donations used to buy Tesco vouchers for women at the Mid-Cambs. refuge.

We would very much like to recruit additional members so that we can continue to be a source of Christian practical action within the Parish and beyond. The sole criteria for membership is that you must have been baptised. There is a small annual subscription which goes to MU Headquarters in London to further the work of MU globally. Over the years the work of St Neots' MU has stretched to prisons, hospitals, running a parent and baby tent at events such as Gransden Show. Our members have knitted items for people with dementia and collected toiletries for hospitals and refuges.

Each individual act of kindness has meant so much to the recipients.
